


CLEAN CAPTAIN BOARD GAME











MATERIALS

1 dice, 1 game board, 20 brown cards, 21 blue cards, 14 green cards

Note: Students will pick their own token to move as their game piece. Their token should be small enough to fit on the game squares and also unique to them, such as a coin, bead, rock, etc.





- 1. Game can be played with 2-6 people. For young students, we recommend including at least 1 player who can read well and guide the other players.
- 2. Players will roll the dice to see who goes first. The person with the highest number will have the first turn, with players continuing in a clockwise manner after.
- 3. All players start with their tokens on "START".
- 4. In each turn, the players will roll the dice one time and move the corresponding number of spaces along the game board.
- 5. If they land on a blue space, they will pick a blue "Clean" card and follow the directions. All blue cards move the player forward or give them an extra turn for rolling the dice.
- 6. If they land on a brown space, they will pick up a brown "Dirty" card and follow the directions. All brown cards move the player backwards or lose them their next turn at rolling the dice.
- 7. If they land on a green space, they will pick up a green "Challenge" card and complete the challenge. All green cards give a task for the player to complete. The other players will judge if the player is correct. If yes, he/ she will move forward or get an extra turn. If no, then he/she will not move forward or backwards in this turn.
- 8. In each turn, the player will only pick up one card for the first space they land on. However, some cards give them an extra turn, which means they will roll again and then get another card since it is considered a new turn.
- 9. The first player to reach "END" wins the game!










You fall in cow poop and don't wash after. Move back 2 spaces.	You miss the school MDA day. Move back to the last brown space.	You forget to tell your family about trachoma. Skip your next turn!	You play outside with your friends and don't wash after. Move back 2 spaces.
You forget to wash your hands after using the latrine. You get sick! Move back to Start.	You wash your face, but you dried it with a dirty towel! Move back 2 spaces.	You wash your face but do not use soap. Move back 1 space .	You get a snack in the market and eat it without washing your hands first. Move back 2 spaces.
You forget to wash your hands before eating. Move back 3 spaces.	The latrine at school is dirty and full of flies. Move back 1 space.	You arrive to school with a dirty face. Skip your next turn!	
You have not washed your face at all today. Skip your next turn!	You went to the bathroom in the field (and not a latrine)! Move back to Start!	Your eyes are itchy and red. Move back 3 spaces.	
Flies keep landing on your dirty face. Move back 1 space.	There is animal poop in the yard where you play at home. Move back 2 spaces.	During the weekend, you do not wash your face. Move back 2 spaces.	
You wash your hands with water but don't use soap. Move back 1 space.	You went to the bathroom in the stream (and not a latrine)! Move back to Start!	You do not have soap at home for washing. Move back to the last brown space.	



You remember to wash your hands with soap before eating. Move forward 3 spaces.	You clean the yard and latrine at home. Move forward 2 spaces.	You go to school for the MDA and take the medicine. Move forward 1 space.	Your friend has red eyes, and you go with him to the health center. Move forward 2 spaces.
Your friend forgets to wash after the latrine! You remind him. Move forward 2 spaces.	After washing your face, you dry it with a clean towel. Move forward 2 spaces.	After playing outside, you wash your hands with soap and water. Move forward 2 spaces.	You teach the other students about trachoma! You get an extra turn!
You convince your parents to build a good latrine. You get an extra turn!	You make sure there is always soap for handwashing at school. You get an extra turn!	You wash your hands with soap and water before eating dinner. Move forward 2 spaces.	
You wash your face with soap and water in the morning and evening. Move forward 3 spaces.	You arrive to school with a clean face. You get an extra turn!	You tell your friend to wash his face to prevent trachoma. Move forward to the next blue space.	
You tell your family about trachoma! Move forward to the next blue space.	You remember to wash your hands with soap after the latrine. Move forward 3 spaces.	The latrines at school are clean and have no flies! Move forward 1 space.	
You stopped your friend from going to the bathroom in the field. Move forward 2 spaces.	You teach your brother how to use the latrine. Move forward to the next blue space.	The teacher compliments you on having a clean face all week. Move forward 3 spaces.	



Tell the group the 3 key times for handwashing. Move forward to blue if correct.	Describe at least 3 ways that trachoma is spread. Move forward to blue if correct.	Sing a song about handwashing! If correct, get an extra turn!
Tell the group 2 key times for face washing. Move forward to blue if correct.	Out of 30 students, 12 have dirty faces. How many have clean faces? Move forward to blue if correct.	Answer: How can you teach the other students in school about trachoma? If it's a good answer, get an extra turn!
Demonstrate how to wash your hands properly. If correct, get an extra turn!	Answer: Why is open defecation bad for health? Move forward to blue if correct.	
Sing a song about the healthy behaviors. If correct, get an extra turn!	Tell a story about a person who gets sick from trachoma. If correct, get an extra turn!	
Act out the symptoms of trachoma without using words. Move forward to blue if correct.	Out of 150 students, 42 have dirty faces. How many have clean faces? Move forward to blue if correct.	
Make up a dance about the healthy behaviors. Move forward to blue if they dance at least 3 behaviors.	Answer: How do flies spread trachoma? Move forward to blue if correct.
